**Captain Darrell R. Lindsey**



On his 46th combat mission, Captain Darrell R. Lindsey was the pilot of the lead plane of a formation of 30 B-26 Bombers from the 394th Bombardment Group on a mission to bomb the critical bridge over the Oise River north of Paris. Lindsey's right engine took a direct hit, engulfing the bomber's wing in flames. Although the B-26 was severely damaged, Lindsey was able to maintain the lead and complete the bombing run. He then held the plane level until his crew was able to bail out safely. Before Captain Lindsey was able to bail out, his Bomber exploded and crashed. Captain Lindsey was the only Marauder Bomber Pilot to receive the Medal of Honor for service in World War II. Today, Captain Lindsey and his crew are honored on a memorial next to the town hall in Saint Prix, France. Darrell R.

Lindsey's remains were not recovered. He is listed on the Tablets of the Missing at Ardennes American Cemetery, Neupre, Belgium. The citation for Lindsey's Medal of Honor ends with these words: "All who are living today from this plane owe their lives to the fact that Captain Lindsey remained cool and showed supreme courage in this emergency."
